Dear Michael Barber:

On April 19, 2023, you requested additional information regarding the above-referenced filing. Herein, Lewis & Ellis is providing our response to that request.

Firstly, see below for the average difference between the initially submitted requested change in charge compared to the amount approved by the Green Mountain Care Board in each of the last eleven years.

Increases to unit costs slowed to a low level, then began rising again in 2018, and ultimately increasing substantially during and following the COVID-19 pandemic.

Your question relates to the currently outstanding BCBSVT Large Group rate filing. Please note that because commercial payers reimburse hospitals at different levels from Medicare and Medicaid, they are affected in a way which is slightly different from these

figures. Historical data on commercial payments in particular is not available, as it only began to be collected systematically last year.
